Club Secretary/Treasurer Corner-1st Quarter

Welcome fellow secretaries &/or treasurers!

I plan to use the VOICE to send out quarterly reminders and helpful hints for these very important club roles.

First, you should have received a link to Optimist Leader which allows you to access the club roster at OI. If you have been in the role prior to this year, your old links should work. Any issues, contact leadership@optimist.org.

Then you should also have a link to Optimist Institute which allows you to access the <u>required</u> training for the roles. Again, if you already had access that should continue to work. Any issues, contact <u>institute@optimist.org</u>.

Then a few things to check on right away. Please make sure that all roster info is current, specifically emails and phone numbers for all members.

Next, by 15 February 2025, all clubs are required to file with the IRS. Since most of the clubs make under \$50,000.00 per year, the Form 990-N (e-postcard) will suffice.

It also might be a good idea to check on your club's status with the Texas Secretary of State: nonprofit status. The regular club is a 501c4 but I know some clubs also have a listing as a 501c3 status. Periodic filings are required every 4 years. FYI, my club has one of our members who is a lawyer as the agent for this.

Look forward to seeing you at district meetings. And again, if I can be of assistance, please contact me.

- 3. Financial Stability. Clubs need to be sure dues are kept current and up to date. Clubs can obtain sponsorships to help with finances also.


These next few months are when clubs do a lot of projects in the community. Good luck with all those projects and make your club known more in the community. Be that ripple in the water that expands and reaches to many others.

Essay Contest 2024 – 2025

THE DISTRICT ESSAY CONTEST WINNER WILL RECEIVE A \$2,500 SCHOLARSHIP

Now is the time to begin preparations for your Club's Essay Contest. If your Club does not currently have an Essay Contest you should start participating. This is a great opportunity to give the youth in your area writing experience as well as a chance for a \$2,500 scholarship. Your Club needs only one member to participate but several members can participate if they are available.



The Club chairperson first becomes familiar with the rules and sets the dates for the contest to begin and end. He or she then gives the applications to schools, churches and other places where you serve youth in your area. The chairperson then selects three qualified judges who are not acquainted with the writers of the essays to pick the top three essays from all of the essays received. At the Club level, the judges may be Optimist Club members. Finally, the Club chairperson delivers the Club's winning essay to the District Chairperson.

Cost

- A \$10.00 fee to South Texas District is required.
- Each Club may award medallions to their winners. These are optional and cost about \$20.00.
- Other awards are permitted at the Club level. Details are in the Club Chair's rules.

Benefits

- Participants get experience writing the essays.
- The District winner receives a Scholarship of \$2,500.00.
- The Club has an opportunity for a meeting program. Invite the three winners to a meeting to read their essays and receive their awards. Also, invite their parents to attend. They may join your club.

Summary of Key Items

- ◆ The official topic for 2024-2025 is "How Optimism Has Paved My Road to Success". The essay contest is open to students under age 19 as of October 1, 2024.
- The Club winning essay along with the other required documents and the \$10.00 District fee must be received by the District contest chair on or before February 28, 2024.
- "Received" means:
 - By e-mail on or before February 28, 2025 email to galester@sbcglobal.net
 - By U.S. mail <u>postmarked</u> on or before February 28, 2025.

The \$10.00 check must be mailed but is not subject to the February 28, 2025 deadline.
